

Covid-19 Catch Up Premium Fund

AMOUNT OF FUNDING - Newport Girls' High School will receive £34,400 in three instalments during the school year 2020-2021. The School Senior Leadership Team and Governors have considered the funding advice and guidelines. This funding is detached from Pupil Premium funding spend, which is reported separately. NGHS intends to allocate funding in the following areas:

Students have been identified following discussions with the HoY, subject teachers and using information from SMID.
Additional My Tutor sessions (this is separate to those who receive MyTutor tuition through PP)	19 students across Year 10 and Year 11	£2,940.00	+	Students who need to consolidate understanding / fill gaps in knowledge are able to do so in core subjects including Maths, English Language/Literature, Sciences via one-to-one tutoring remotely from home and/or in school on a weekly basis for 10 weeks. Depending on pupils' needs, they may have up to two session per week with a highly recommended tutor.
Wellbeing Officer time to support pupils in returning to school after the Covidlockdown including counselling	All students who require support from WBO (1/3 of contract time is being used.)	£4,388.40	#	Students who have faced hardship and difficulty at home are able to discuss their concerns and get help in a safe, secure environment. This will help improve their attainment, too.
Staff-led Easter revision sessions £112 per day x 16 sessions	Years II & I3	£1,792.00	+	Sessions available to students in subjects where performance has been most hampered by Covid-related absences. Greater confidence with examinations and exam-style questions.
