## **NEWPORT GIRLS' HIGH SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY FOR SIXTH FORM**

Our Sixth Form uniform policy and dress code have been drawn up in consultation with students, parents, staff and members of the local community, including faith groups.

### **Aims**

A high standard of personal appearance is expected of all students. Through our uniform and dress codes we aim to:

- Encourage pride in the school
- Support teaching and learning
- Enable students to be comfortable, safe and secure
- Ensure that girls of different social, religious and ethnic groups feel welcome
- Encourage a sense of equality and cohesion
- Protect students from social pressures to dress in a particular way

In this way, the uniform and dress codes contribute to the overall aims of the school.

We expect all students to observe a **smart dress code** with a high standard of tidiness and smartness. Although we wish students to be able to exercise some personal choice, **the code of dress is one suitable for a working environment, avoiding items which are too casual.**

The sixth form uniform for September 2021 will be black and white and should be worn as follows:

- A plain black smart jacket
- **Smart black/black-white/ black - grey trousers** (styles such as denim, cropped trousers, hipsters and leggings are not permitted) or **smart black skirt**, worn **close to the knees** (no tube styles or lycra)
- A **smart black / white / black and white blouse** (long or short sleeved) not T-shirts or vest tops – patterned blouses are acceptable if black and/or white and/ or grey
- Alternatively, a **smart dress (black and/or grey/ and/ or white) worn close to the knee** (which would be appropriate in a business environment) can be worn with a plain black smart jacket
- Plain long sleeved cardigan or jumper if required in either black/ white/ grey
- Belt – should be discrete and black or white in colour
- Smart black / black-white shoes with a sensible heel (no stilettos)
- Tights should be smart and either black, grey, white or tan.
- No trainers, casual shoes or ankle boots
- Lanyards must be worn at all times with the name and photograph showing

### **Other Uniform Expectations:**

- Subtle jewellery and make-up are permitted. Fake tan and acrylic nails not permitted.
- Beading is permitted in school colours (black/ grey/ white)
- Unnatural hair colouring is not permitted, the interpretation of 'unnatural' is as follows:
  - a colour that is not found within the natural hair colour spectrum, ie. bright, extreme or vivid colour (eg. crimson red or purple)
  - a combination of colours that is easily visible or stark in contrast (eg. dip dye hairstyles)
- One small pair of earrings may be worn only. These will have to be removed on the instruction of staff for practical lessons
- Other facial piercings are not permitted
- No tattoos that are visible whilst wearing school uniform or PE kit.
- Muslim students who wish to wear the hijab (headscarf) may do so, provided that the fabric is plain, lightweight and black/ grey/ white

- Outdoor clothing, including coats, hats and scarves, must be removed on arrival at school and not worn around the main school building.
- Outdoor coats should be smart
- Hoodies are not permitted to be worn in school unless specific permission is given (e.g. on leavers day)

### **Sixth Form PE kit**

From September 2021, Sixth Form students will be expected to purchase a regulation PE top and / or hoodie from Newport Sports shop to wear for their PE lessons and extra-curricular activities.

A range of options are available to suit individual preference.

Students can select their own choice of navy blue sports shorts, leggings and / or tracksuit bottoms. Any other items of PE kit or difference in colour to the list will not be permitted and repeated incidents will be reported to the Head of Sixth Form.

**The Head of Sixth Form will deal with all matters relating to uniform. The decision as to what constitutes acceptable uniform rests with the Head of Sixth Form and Headteacher. Photographs of suitable clothing styles are shown for information on the next page.**

### **Cost of Uniform**

We want to ensure that the cost of uniform does not deter any girl from applying to the school, nor leads to students feeling socially excluded or unable to afford other necessities. All regulation items provided by the school stockist compare **very favourably** with other providers. Parents who are unable to provide their daughter with the required items of PE kit should contact the school. Such approaches will be handled with discretion and sensitivity. The PE kit suppliers, costs and quality of the uniform are reviewed annually to ensure that parents are provided with good quality clothing at an affordable price.

### **Enforcement of the Uniform Policy**

It is the responsibility of parents and Sixth Form students to ensure that their daughter comes to school in the correct uniform and PE kit (see the Home School Agreement). Form tutors are responsible for monitoring uniform; all staff have a responsibility for ensuring that students are correctly dressed in class and elsewhere on the school site.

A student wearing non-uniform clothing will be sent to the Sixth Form office to change into uniform clothing for the remainder of the day. In the event of repeated uniform infringements or unacceptable hair colour, parents will be contacted and the student will risk being sent home. In the case of jewellery and other accessories, the student will be asked to remove the item, which may be confiscated.

### **Issues Arising from the Policy**

Parents should raise any issues relating to school uniform, dress codes or other aspects of appearance with the Headteacher. Requests to vary the uniform requirements for particular reasons, such as medical needs, will always be carefully considered.

Students should raise issues with their tutor and Head of Year; they may also request that uniform matters, including proposals for change, be put onto the agenda of Year and School Council meetings.

### **Policy Reviews**

**Our uniform regulations are reviewed regularly and parents, pupils and staff will be consulted; the review includes consideration of uniform items, supply, cost and value for money. This is due for review again in September 2022.**
