IMPORTANT BUS UPDATES

With the exception of the Market Drayton morning bus, Haberdashers' Adams (HA) buses will not be running on **Wednesday 18 July** as they have their Sports Day at Oakengates. Parents will need to make alternative arrangements to get their daughters to school.
