
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The views of parents are instrumental to us evaluating our work in school and planning for the future. Ms Capaldi and I were pleased to receive responses Year 7 Parents Sur from over half of our Year 7 parents about the transition that their daughters had had from primary school and their first perceptions of NGHS. Here is the feedback from the survey using the statements provided by Ofsted. Of particular importance is the 100% agreement that the girls are safe in school. This



echoes the findings of my full parent survey last January. Below are some of the positives/areas for development suggested by parents and our thoughts. Thank you to everyone who returned surveys by the closing date.



Areas of particular strength identified included:

- Safe, happy environment for girls to learn with strong community feeling $\mathbf{\Lambda}$
- ☑ High academic results and reputation
- ☑ Excellent standards of behaviour
- ☑ Positive competition in house activities and in lessons
- ☑ Enthusiasm of staff/leadership team
- ☑ Weekly communication newsletter
- Team-building activities
- We were also particularly pleased to read of the positive impact our extra-

curricular clubs were having on Y7 pupils. This was an area for improvement in the January 2018 parents survey. Older students are now running some clubs as well as mentoring support, which is most welcome.

Some areas for improvement have already been acted on. For example:

- \Rightarrow We have already scheduled TWO transition days on the same days as Telford & Wrekin LA schools in July.
- \Rightarrow We will include more peer-to-peer activities on these transition days
- \Rightarrow We will schedule a separate E-Safety evening to the induction evening, which was quite heavily focused on this important topic. However, it does form the majority of issues we have to address pastorally in school
- \Rightarrow We understand concerns about a potential uniform change and will respond to these once the governors have seen the feedback to our consultation email address, which has now closed.
- \Rightarrow Curriculum and uniform information is on our website some parents said they needed this sooner.
- \Rightarrow Awards for kindness and form time the Thank You Friday is one example of this.
- \Rightarrow Drama on the curriculum this is something I would like to implement, but we require funding and a space!

Finally, one parent felt the school was not well managed because "NGHS is severely underfunded" - I agree wholeheartedly! All ideas welcome and I will continue to work with Governors to make the most of our situation as a small school.

HEALTH & WELLBEING TOP TIP!

Spending more time outdoors can have vast impacts on personal wellbeing, such as improving short-term memory and focus and even boosting creativity. A study found that walking for 10 minutes increased 81% of participants' creativity. Being outdoors also improves mood and increases self-esteem, another study found that outdoor walks could be "clinically useful as a supplement to existing treatments" for major depressive disorder. (Form A5)
