very Happy New Year to all our parents and families. I trust that you all enjoyed a break during the holiday period and that those who celebrated Christmas, Hanukkah or indeed any other festival had an enjoyable and

peaceful time. It was a pleasure to welcome our students back on Monday and whilst it's been a quiet week in terms of special activities in school, it's been good to see students quickly get back into the rhythm of school life. Last night saw our Year 11 Parents Evening; an important time for the students in this year group now that the mock examinations are over and we look forward to supporting them in the coming weeks in making their A-level choices. Equally, our Year 8s will be reaching important decisions this half term in relation to their GCSE choices and more information will come to parents and students on Monday 20 January.

The Carol Services last term are a fairly distant memory now, but I would like to thank the 60 or so students who participated and made both the evening services and the last day services very enjoyable. Thank you also to all the parents who took time to email in positive comments during last term on a range of matters; this is always appreciated by staff. At the end of term, I received a lovely email from a careers consultant who worked with Year 10. She commented that the ideas they had shared were of real benefit to her company's understanding of how to attract a workforce in the future and she had really enjoyed her time at NGHS.

With the new year come some new opportunities. The first came home yesterday in a letter. Mr Carey joined the Chemistry department last September after over twenty years leading the department at Wolverhampton Grammar School. In his interview, he made a generous offer to re-start a school ski trip. He has run a trip to Austria for many years and has used his contacts to source a wonderful opportunity for skiers (advanced and novice) in 2021. As with all foreign trips, I appreciate the demands that costs can put on families and that not all families are in a position to apply for a place on a foreign trip such as this. However, I am always happy to talk to parents about ways to spread costs and I can assure you that we work hard to bring the costs down to the best value possible. We also run other more inexpensive visits locally, nationally and

internationally to balance the more expensive opportunities that are still in demand.

This week has seen relatively warm temperatures for January. This may change over the next few weeks. Students and parents are reminded of the arrangements for school closure, which can be found HERE on our website. The website is definitely the best source of information and we will always aim to publish any school closures around 7-7.15am on the day in question. This area of the country can have heavy snowfall and therefore it is important to pay close attention to the website. In the event of a school closure during the day, which is always a last resort, it is important that students all know the best option to get to a place of safety. We will never let students leave school without parental consent, so please make sure your daughter knows how she can get hold of you to agree a method of getting home in the event of poor weather setting in.

On that point, please also make sure you keep us updated with up-to-date contact numbers. The pastoral team and I have called three parents this week at work to find they no longer work at that particular place. We have around 600 girls on site and must be able to contact you in the event of medical emergency. The SIMS Parent app is the best place to make any changes or please speak to our helpful Data Manager, Mrs Jones, if you are unable to do these changes online. Thank you for your assistance in this important matter.

Finally, I have included this term's extra-curricular activities programme as an attachment as well as a letter from the local Police concerning parking around schools. This has been distributed to all schools locally. Parents and sixth form drivers need to be aware of the changes to enforcement that come in to place shortly (this information was also advised back in the autumn term). I am told that the council are planning to be very proactive in monitoring their new powers. Whilst I appreciate the weather is not always pleasant in the morning, dropping students in town or collecting them there in the afternoon is an option to consider and sixth formers must park with consideration and within the law/highway code. The school remains supportive, but impartial and passes this information on at the request of the Police.

Pupil Attitudes to Self and School


