WELCOME BACK!

It is with great pleasure that I welcome you to the first edition of Head Lines for the 2025–26 academic year. Whether you are returning to our school community or joining the NGHS family for the first time, I hope the summer break provided a chance to rest, recharge, and prepare for the exciting year ahead.

We begin the term with a sense of pride and celebration following another exceptional set of public examination results. At A-level, 50% of all grades were awarded at A* or A, with 78% at A*-B. Thirty-four students achieved all A* or A grades, and we were thrilled to see our students secure places at prestigious universities including Oxford Cambridge, as well as competitive apprenticeships in law, finance, and media. At GCSE, 76.4% of all grades were at Grade 7 or above, with nearly a third at the top Grade 9. These results are a testament to the hard work, resilience, and ambition of our students, and the unwavering support of our staff and families.

As you will see in this first edition of Newport News, our site team has had a busy summer holiday developing the school site in a number of areas. We now look forward to our students benefitting from these improvements over the coming years, including updates to our Sixth Form Atrium Café and Centenary



Hall. These developments have enhanced our Sixth Form study facilities and enabled us to reintroduce a library space into the school, which will be available to all students during lunchtime.

Looking ahead, I am pleased to introduce a new initiative that will help us continue to provide the very best learning environment for our students. From this term, we are launching the NGHS School Development Fund - a programme designed to support our digital learning strategy. The fund will help us increase the number of devices available to students, upgrade existing equipment, and ensure equitable access to technology across the school. A separate letter with full details and donation options will follow shortly, and I encourage all families to consider supporting this important initiative. Every contribution - no matter the size - will make a meaningful difference.

Finally, a brief message regarding the collection of students at the end of the school day. It has understandably been busy on Wellington Road, not helped by torrential downpours and a



broken pedestrian crossing. I would be grateful for your assistance in a few areas. Firstly, if you are meeting your daughter, please wait off the school site and agree in advance where you will meet. Kindly avoid parking in the bus laybys near the school, as they are in use by various school coaches and public buses at this time. 














NEW COSTA COFFEE OUTLET A MASSIVE HIT AT THE START OF TERM!



HOW TO GET IN TOUCH!

COMMUNICATION WITH SCHOOL

Over the course of the year, we will communicate with you in a variety of ways:

- Every two weeks, we publish **Newport News** on the school website. This document includes news from school, highlights upcoming events, and recent achievements. A link to each edition is sent home by email.
- An annual **Parents' Evening** to update you on your daughter's progress.
- **Grade sheets** and/or **written reports** to update you on your daughter's progress.
- An annual **parent information evening** to outline the key information relevant to each year group. This is in person for Year 7 and remote for other year groups.
- Relevant **letters** to your daughter are sent home via email.
- If teaching or pastoral staff have any concerns relating to your daughter, they will contact you **by phone** or **email**.

Occasions may arise when you need to contact the school to share information or raise concerns. There are several ways in which you can do this, including:

- By telephone **01952 797550** If possible, your call will be put through to an appropriate member of staff. Where this is not possible (member of staff is teaching/not in school/unavailable), a message will be taken and passed to an appropriate member of staff. You should expect a response to your call within 24 hours.
- By email schooloffice@nghs.org.uk You will receive an acknowledgement email once this has been received and be notified that the email has been passed to the appropriate member of staff (this may not always be to whom the email was addressed). You should then expect a response within 24-48 hours of this acknowledgement.
- By **letter** to the school.
- By **recording a note** in the communication section of your daughter's **planner** to be shared with a member of staff.

During school holidays, reception is closed and phone calls/emails cannot be responded to until we return to school. During the school holidays, **urgent@nghs.org.uk** is available to communicate key urgent information; it should not be used to send routine enquiries that can be responded to when school is open again. This account will be checked once every 24 hours by a senior member of staff. They will then make an appropriate response to any email that has been received.
