Not only did they continue to improve and achieve excellent results, but they also showed great sportsmanship by supporting and encouraging one another throughout the evening. Both teams qualified for this final in 2nd place in their semi final the week before and knew that this would be a high standard of competition against the top schools in Shropshire.

UCAS ONLINE INFORMATION MEETING

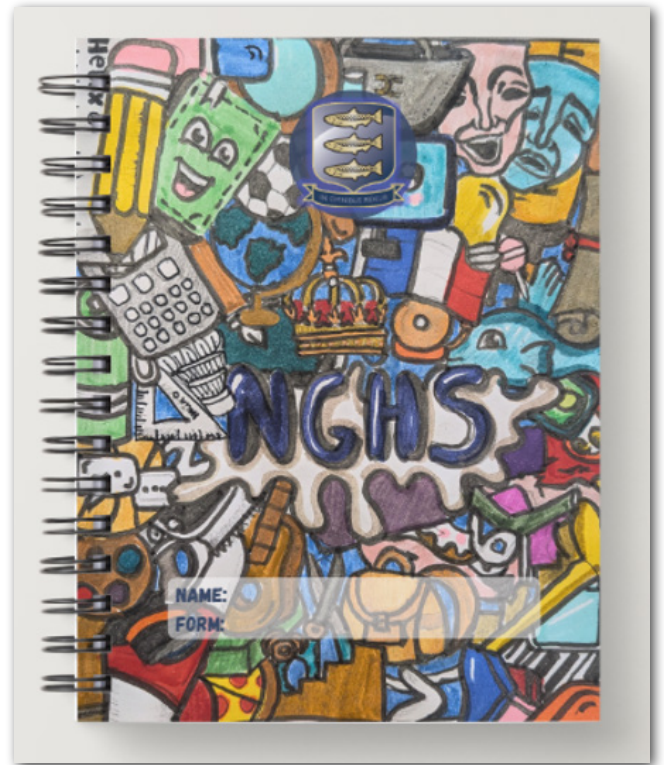

Uniform Checks – Summary

Over the past few weeks, we have carried out a series of uniform checks for students in Years 7 to 10. It has been particularly pleasing to see that most of our students continue to wear their uniform smartly and take pride in their appearance.

As communicated in previous correspondence, the purpose of these checks was not only to celebrate the many students who consistently meet our expectations, but also to provide gentle reminders and supportive conversations where aspects of uniform did not meet the required standard. Our aim is to ensure that all students are fully prepared to meet our expectations from the start of the new academic year in September.

I have now reviewed the outcomes from all four year groups, and the overall picture is extremely positive. Across the year groups reviewed, 82.4% of students met our uniform expectations, with 17.6% requiring a reminder about one or more aspects of the uniform policy. The majority of these issues were minor and easily rectified ahead of September.

Summary of Findings

The most common issue identified was skirt length, affecting 13.0% of students, often due to students having grown since their skirts were originally purchased. Families are therefore encouraged to check skirt length over the summer and replace items where necessary.

A small number of students required reminders regarding the following:

- Hair colour (0.4% of students), where colouring was not a natural shade.
- Jewellery (1.1% of students), including hoop earrings, bracelets, and necklaces.
- Make-up (1.3% of students), including Key Stage 3 students wearing make-up or Key Stage 4 students wearing excessive make-up or false eyelashes.
- Sports socks being worn instead of school socks (1.7% of students).
- Footwear (1.1% of students), including one student wearing boots and four wearing black trainers instead of school shoes.

Thank you to all parents and carers for their continued support in maintaining our high standards. We appreciate your help in ensuring that any necessary uniform adjustments are made over the summer so that all students return in September ready to learn and looking smart from the very first day. **Mrs H Birch, Assistant Headteacher**

We now look forward to the main Sports Day event, where we can expect even more house spirit, cheering, sportsmanship and fun.

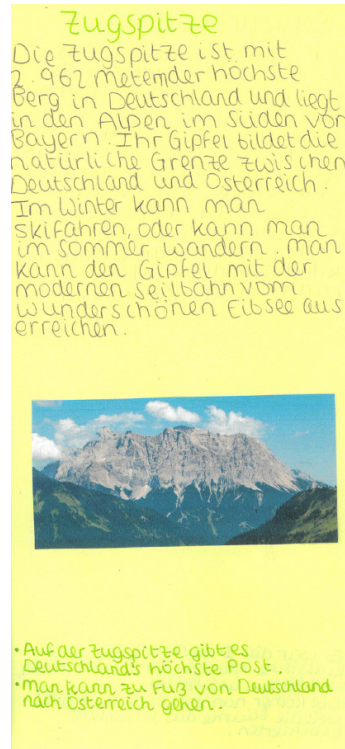
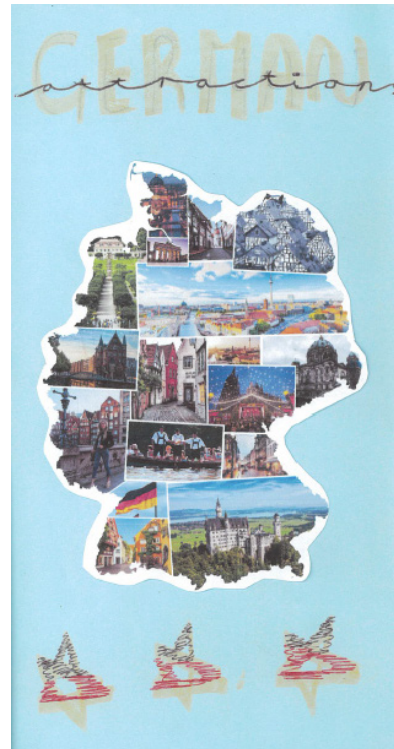

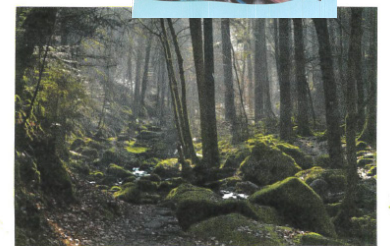
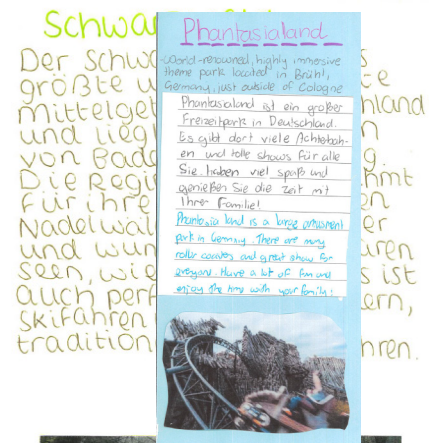


Schloss Neuschwanstein

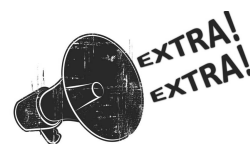

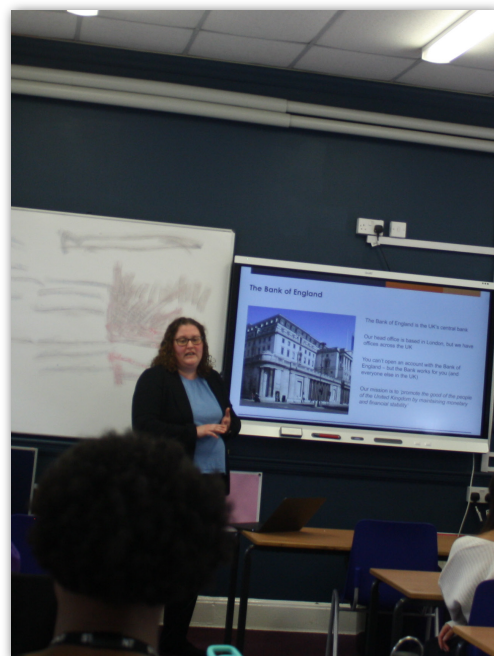

Confronted by a veritable challenge, our entrants excelled; we received a commendation in French, Spanish, German, Russian and Mandarin, and I became the national winner for Italian Level 2, meaning that NGHS was awarded in every language available to partake in. HARDBALL CRICKET TEAM OFF TO A WINNING START!



On Thursday 18th June, NGHS proudly took part in its first ever hardball cricket fixture, facing Thomas Adams at Wem Cricket Club. The match was part of the newly formed Knight Stokes Cup—a competition designed exclusively for state schools. This historic occasion saw a mixed team of Year 7–10 students, with some players experienced in hardball cricket while others were stepping up to the format for the very first time. In glorious sunshine, Thomas Adams won the toss and elected to bowl.

Newport started confidently, scoring freely with a number of deliveries dispatched to the boundary. The team showed excellent composure, building partnerships and maintaining a steady run rate throughout their 20 overs. Newport finished on an impressive 132 for 7 off their 20 overs. The standout performance coming from Year 8's Kiret B, who produced a superb unbeaten 50, anchoring the innings with a mixture of boundaries and solid defensive work.

After a short drinks break, it was Thomas Adams' turn to bat. Newport's bowlers made an immediate impact, delivering a tight and accurate performance from the outset. Pressure built quickly, and wickets began to fall at regular intervals thanks to disciplined bowling and sharp fielding. Thomas Adams were eventually bowled out for just 52 runs, securing a convincing victory for Newport. The pick of the bowlers was Year 8's Hargun D, who claimed 3 wickets, although the entire team contributed brilliantly to the win.

Captain and Year 10 Student, Shaan K, was delighted with the team and remarked, "A really good performance in our first ever hardball match! Everyone performed really well and it was great to finally play some hardball cricket."

This outstanding performance marks a memorable start to Newport's journey in hardball cricket and they now progress to the Shropshire Finals at Shrewsbury School on Monday 29th June.

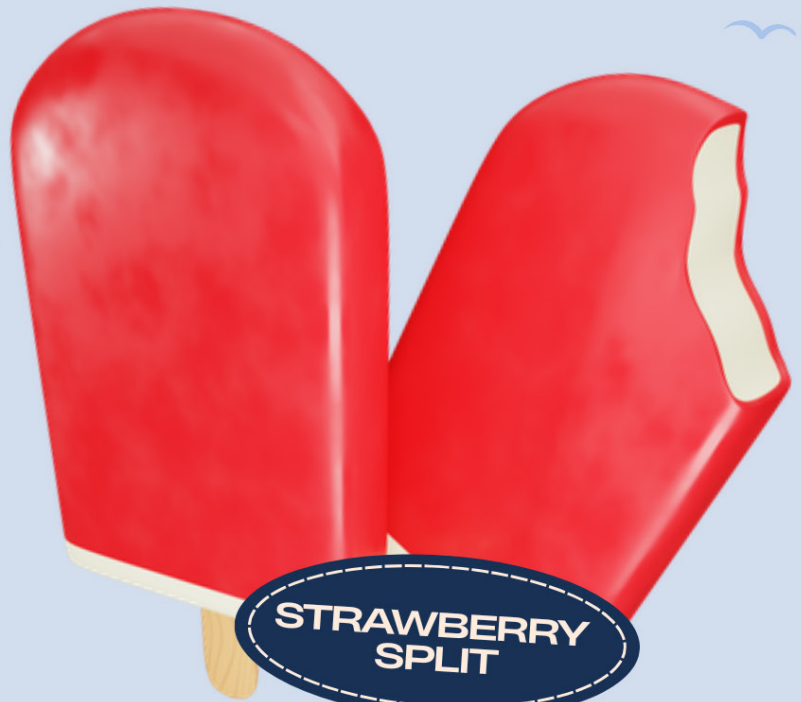

COMMUNICATION WITH SCHOOL

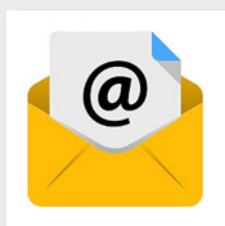
Over the course of the year, we will communicate with you in a variety of ways:

- Every two weeks, we publish **Newport News** on the school website. This document includes news from school, highlights upcoming events, and recent achievements. A link to each edition is sent home by email.
- An annual **Parents' Evening** to update you on your daughter's progress.
- **Grade sheets** and/or **written reports** to update you on your daughter's progress.
- An annual **parent information evening** to outline the key information relevant to each year group. This is in person for Year 7 and remote for other year groups.
- Relevant **letters** to your daughter are sent home via email.
- If teaching or pastoral staff have any concerns relating to your daughter, they will contact you **by phone** or **email**.

Occasions may arise when you need to contact the school to share information or raise concerns. There are several ways in which you can do this, including:

- By telephone – **01952 797550** – If possible, your call will be put through to an appropriate member of staff. Where this is not possible (member of staff is teaching/not in school/unavailable), a message will be taken and passed to an appropriate member of staff. You should expect a response to your call within 24 hours.
- By email – **schooloffice@nghs.org.uk** – You will receive an acknowledgement email once this has been received and be notified that the email has been passed to the appropriate member of staff (this may not always be to whom the email was addressed). You should then expect a response within 24-48 hours of this acknowledgement.
- By **letter** to the school.
- By **recording a note** in the communication section of your daughter's **planner** to be shared with a member of staff.

During school holidays, reception is closed and phone calls/emails cannot be responded to until we return to school. During the school holidays, **urgent@nghs.org.uk** is available to communicate key urgent information; it should not be used to send routine enquiries that can be responded to when school is open again. This account will be checked once every 24 hours by a senior member of staff. They will then make an appropriate response to any email that has been received.

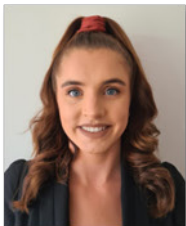

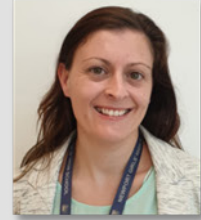
