



A second, fantastic award for NGHS for our Mental Health support



We are very proud of the ongoing work that we do in school to support student and staff mental health. Over the last academic year, I have been working with the Carnegie Centre of Excellence to help the School gain accreditation for the Mental Health in Schools Award. This is an award that looks at eight key strands and judges the work going on in school against specific criteria against these strands.



When I first embarked on this award, I had thought that as a school we would be presenting our evidence of the work that we do from our usual school environment. Covid-19 has meant quite a lot of change for the school in terms of what we were expecting to do and what we have ended up providing. However, in lots of ways it has provided us with lots of additional areas to showcase; it was nice to be able to share my thoughts on the Bounce Back Curriculum, which has supported student mental health, but which wouldn't have happened without us having lived life in lockdown from March 2020.

I am delighted to be able to share that we have been accredited with the **silver award** due to the fantastic work that has been happening in this area of school life.

As Christmas is fast approaching (only 49 days), it is time to launch the Christmas Smile project at NGHS. Christmas

Smile is a charitable organisation based in Telford, providing the most vulnerable local residents the pleasure of opening a present on Christmas Day. At this time there are various codes we have to use for absences (non Covid-related, Covid-related, medical, appointment etc.) so we would appreciate your support with the following procedures for informing us of your daughter's absence and helping us to record absence correctly. Thank you.



- ☑ If your daughter is unwell please contact the Office by email (schooloffice@nghs.org.uk) or leave a message for Reception on 01952 797550 by 8.30am on the first day of absence. Thereafter please could you update us **daily** by email or telephone so that we are aware that she remains unwell and is not expected in school.
- ☑ If your daughter experiences sickness or diarrhoea the '48 hour rule' applies, and she should not return to school until 48 hours after the last episode.
- ☑ We appreciate that medical and dental appointments become available 'at the last minute' and in these times it they can be difficult to plan. Where possible, please continue to avoid school hours for appointments and please provide as much notice as possible. An email to schooloffice@nghs.org.uk explaining the nature of the appointment, date/time, and when your daughter needs to be collected from school (if necessary) would be helpful.
- ☑ If you wish to speak to a member of teaching staff, form tutor or Head of Year, please be aware that, given their teaching commitments, the best way to contact staff is via an email to schooloffice@nghs.org.uk. The mailbox is monitored throughout school hours, and the message can be relayed to members of staff who will contact you when they are able to. Remember some staff teach 5 periods and only have a short lunch.
- ☑ If you receive a missed call from the school and the member of staff did not leave a message, they will call you back or email you. It is not always possible to speak to the member of staff straight away if you call back as they may no longer be available.
- ☑ If your daughter or any member of the household has symptoms of Covid I9, you must remain at home and let us know using the procedures above. Any test results must also be communicated to the school.

NGHS Cyber Defender

During August, at the end of the school holidays I partook in the GCHQ Cyberfirst Defenders course for two weeks. There are many courses like these, run by the Smallpeice Trust, not just in Cybersecurity but many other areas of expertise, e.g. the RAF engineering course a friend of mine did. However, Cyberfirst runs all the courses related to cybersecurity, I was on one of these courses. I'm sure most people within the school have heard of the CyberFirst national girls' competition, so I recommend the people who enjoyed the competition have a look at the CyberFirst courses. There are many activities for different age groups, such as the CyberFirst Trailblazers for II-I2 year olds and CyberFirst Adventurers for I3-I4 year olds. Though the official courses that give accreditation are for I4-I7 year olds and those who are I8-I9 can apply for bursary degree and apprenticeship. I personally did the Cyberfirst Defenders course for I4-I5 year olds and it was interesting and enjoyable, learning about more than I ever knew before about the internet.

An example of the materials learnt about in the course are:

- ⇒ Cryptography, the method of protecting data, information and communications through the use of codes. An example of this is when you encrypt your messages on devices, keeping your information safe from hackers.
- ⇒ Digital Forensics
- ⇒ Penetration Testing
- ⇒ Open Source intelligence

These many topics teach you about how to defend yourself and your family from online crime and you learn from the trained professionals in cybersecurity and hacking, about what cybersecurity is and what the jobs involve. There's also lectures from professionals high up in the industry where you can ask questions.
