## A weekly update from NGHS

his week marks twelve months since the closing of schools on 20 March 2020. The impact of the pandemic has been far-reaching and is of course still not over. Each and every decision has been painstaking

and of course public opinion always differs. Perhaps one day I will write a book! Many Headteachers are sadly leaving the profession or retiring early. There will be time to reflect fully on what we can learn and make good use of going forward as not every new aspect of the pandemic has been negative. Attendance is at an all-time high and it is so lovely to see the school busy once again. A huge thank you to parents for logging on to the testing portal to record home testing results. I must admit I logged in with trepidation on Thursday, but was confronted with hundreds of logs by staff, parents and sixth form students. **Don't forget the next test is due to be completed on Sunday with the result in the database for Monday.** If you have any problems, please contact us via covidreturn@nghs.org.uk.

Students picked up their home test kits this week. Thank you to Mrs Davenport and her team for their sterling work in distributing them in a controlled manner. Students have been supplied with six tests (Year 13 just received 3 as the delivery was short but the next batch have arrived today. Year 13 should collect a second box from Reception on Monday.) Students in Y7-12 have enough to last until into the Easter break and testing and recording should continue throughout. More tests will arrive by then. I need to remain on call for the first six days to contact trace any positive tests and will share information about how to contact me during this first week of the holiday in due course.

Year 13 have sat a second mock exam paper this week in each subject. Once again their conduct and approach has been nothing short of outstanding and my colleagues will be spending the next week marking their work. We are still awaiting final guidance from Ofqual concerning the grading of students for GCSE and A-level. We have a draft plan, which we will formalise and share with students and families once we have verified this against the final guidance. There is much speculation in the media and, whilst this clearly leads to anxiety and concern, I would reiterate that we are committed to working to the **final** guidance alone to avoid ambiguity and our professional, meticulous approach was regularly cited as excellent by last year's students. We do not intend to fall short of this in 2021.

Below I share exciting news about a project NGHS is going to be leading across the region. Also, if you live locally, you may have seen that the local press has picked up on our staff's sterling work in supporting MIND and there's more information on page four.

Our fundraising team of parents/governors have asked me to share information about our nearly-finished science lab on page I. ### **FLEXIBLE WORKING AMBASSADOR STATUS**

I'm delighted to confirm that NGHS has been chosen as one of only eight schools across the UK to lead a project for the Department for Education around flexible working. We have a large number of part-time staff at NGHS and consider requests for part-time working carefully as well as timetabling prudently to avoid splitting classes to accommodate part-time working. NGHS will receive a grant to produce training materials for other schools and to host a variety of virtual and face-to-face events (next year) to raise awareness of ways to accommodate more face-to-face learning. Examples include staggered retirements, child-care friendly hours, job-sharing, staff working different hours on different days etc. This is one of the reasons why NGHS is able to retain such dedicated and experienced staff and ultimately this benefits our students. The FWAS project will be led by Mr Scott with help from other senior leaders and lasts until 2023. # Headlice Awareness



Headlice infection is a problem of the whole community, not just schools. It is common in holiday time and during lockdown as well as during the term.

Parents may worry more when their children return to school, however most infections are caught from close family members and friends. It is not just children who have them, adults get Headlice too!

Headlice are a problem in many communities and do not reflect poor hygiene or social status.

Please could we ask you do your part to prevent any spread of this condition, by checking your children's hair on a regular basis? <u>Tying hair back</u> <u>is recommended</u>. Students in Year 7 and Year 8 are most often affected. If you discover a case of Headlice, it is helpful if you could let the school know. The information you give will be treated in confidence.
