
Back inside, there was a chance to peek behind internal doors and see the interior transformation so far.

This week some girls have been involved in choosing seats for the new classrooms and more furniture samples are arriving.



She's a Jolly Good 'Fellow!'

Huge congratulations must go to Mrs Seys who recently successfully completed a Fellowship programme run by the Historical Association! This is a highly respected programme in which teacher fellows engage with the latest academic research in their field with a view to bringing the latest historiography and pedagogy into the classroom, ensuring a knowledge-rich curriculum for students. The fellowship programme is supported by some of the leading research historians in the country and involved sessions focussed on themes such as war and remembrance in the twentieth century and languages of remembrance. Mrs Seys developed a research specialism within the theme of conflict, art and remembrance, researching into the experiences of soldiers from places across Britain's empire, such as Africa and the West Indies, whose stories and contributions have not been widely recognised in the traditional narrative of remembrance and commemoration. She produced an amazing resource based on case studies of the experiences of individual soldiers, which can be viewed at www.historyhive.co.uk



AS PE SUMMER OF SEMINARS

#BEINSPIRED

Elaine Rice



This week the AS PE students were joined by former Northern Ireland Netball player and Head Coach Elaine Rice. Elaine played in two World Cups and then in 2008 she became the senior coach for the Netball team. Between 2008 and 2018 she helped the team move from 19th world ranking to within the top ten as well as leading them through many world cups and the 2018 Commonwealth Games. She stepped down after the team qualified for the 2018 World Cup in Liverpool.

During our discussion with Elaine, she gave detailed insights into being a coach as well as a player and how personalities of both coach and players affect the team. We engaged in talking about our own personalities as sportswomen as well as discussing team culture and cohesion which are both important, particularly within

team sports including netball. She then went on to explain her experiences as a player and coach, both negative and positive as well as answering some challenging questions off the students regarding the impact of COVID and injuries to name a few - she explained her first-hand experience of having a torn ACL and the impact of it in her netball. The session was detailed and insightful, aiding our understanding on sports psychology and providing us with practical examples.

This was the third seminar of the term providing us with a rare opportunity to interact with high level sports people to enhance our understanding of the topic and develop our depth of knowledge.
