really quick update this week from me as we embark on the final three weeks of the summer term. Unfortunately we have had a handful of cases of Covid19 in our Year 12 population this week and I understand

how frustrating this is for families where students are having to isolate. We work closely with our local Public Health team, must obey their requests regarding isolation and I cannot override these decisions. Part of the reason for the rise has been the continued lateral flow testing at home and I hope that your child has brought home the final seven test pack for this academic year. We have some spare packs in school so would advise Year I2 to do tests more regularly than twice a week (minimum Sundays and Wednesdays). Two of the positive cases were from asymptomatic students and it is thanks to (y)our proactive lateral flow testing that these students were identified.

Colleagues have continued with their primary visits in person and on Teams this week and our A-level and GCSE teacher assessed grades have been scrutinised by exam boards following the submission date last week. Many parents have attended Work Experience and UCAS

This week we have been made aware that Childline and the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) have developed a brand new tool so that children and young people can report a nude image or video of themselves that has been uploaded to the internet so that IWF can take steps to remove it . This tool has launched on the 22 June 2021.

From conversations in our PSHE review meetings this week we know that there are many reasons for taking / sharing images but also many barriers which prevent young people from reporting the images and videos to adults at home and at school.

This new tool will allow young people to take action themselves and to be reassured that something will be done.

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
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Geography lectures to begin this term
