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School Fundraising Update

When I launched our challenge to students to help raise funds for our Primed for Success campaign to furnish and equip our new classrooms, computer suite and dining room in the modern, comfortable and high-quality style that NGHS students deserve, I had every confidence that they would rise to the occasion with innovative, creative and exciting fundraising ideas. They have most certainly delivered on this! Fundraising efforts have included sponsored acrobatic gliding, 23-mile bike rides, swimming, multiple Wrekin climbs and (equally challenging for some of our more talkative students), sponsored silences. Entrepreneurs amongst the students and staff have put their talents to excellent use to produce keyrings, candles, pompoms, bookmarks, earrings and even baby tomato plants to sell to friends, family and other members of our school community. 9R and IOX have approached the fundraising challenge as a whole form, running a Euros sweepstake and a charity netball match. Students from 8 Seacole in particular have impressed me so far with their enthusiasm for the cause and creativity in their fundraising ideas, and it has become a semi-regular occurrence to see individuals walking around school dressed as highwaymen and other random characters!

There have been some spectacular individual fundraising efforts: Darcey G in 7S raised an incredible £455; Mrs Machin from the Finance Office raised £340; Alanah M in 7R raised a fantastic £115.00 and Lily E in 7S has raised £66.50. These are truly fantastic totals and will make a huge difference. As I said when I launched the campaign though, every contribution, no matter how small it seems, will make a big difference. If every member of our school community was able to raise just £30, this would amount to £18 000 in total! I would like to extend sincere thanks on behalf of myself and the other members of the Primed for Success fundraising committee for all your efforts so far.

I know that there are many students who have planned their activities and are due to complete them over the next few weeks – good luck to all of you! Please remember to hand in any money raised to Mrs Aldridge in the Finance Office and to let her know your name, form and what you have done so that I can keep updating our totaliser and keep track of how the different houses are doing. Current totals are shown below.
