

Our Year 13s have proven themselves worthy academics and have all gained valuable skills ready for the first year of undergraduate study and/or presentation skills for the world of employment. I really enjoy teaching Year 13 this course and although I have thirteen 5000 word essays and projects to mark over Easter (!) I really do enjoy reading about such a wide range of topics (and always learn some new facts along the way!) Well done to them all.

In line with the rest of the country, Covid numbers have risen at NGHS this week, and we have had some more staff absence. Obtaining high-quality supply teachers has been very difficult and, as ever, I am grateful to staff who have been well enough to teach on Teams from home whilst others have been pretty unwell. We have welcomed back a few staff towards the end of this week, which gives hope that things are getting back to normal. Thank you to all the students who have had lessons affected and have got on well with their cover work this week.

In our recent parent surveys, it has been great to read such positive praise for NGHS. One sticking point however is the question 'the school lets me know what my child is learning'. About 3 years ago, we published, on our website, learning overviews and curriculum statements for each faculty. The overviews are similar to what many other schools are now doing. We highlight these at our Parent Information Evenings in September, but I appreciate not all parents attended these evenings online. I would appreciate some feedback from parents as to whether these have simply not been viewed or whether they are not meeting the needs of parents. It would be impractical to provide a week-by-week guide to every subject as changes do occur, but it would be

helpful to know more about what you feel is most helpful to you, as parents. If you feel you can provide some constructive feedback, please offer your thoughts via schooloffice@nghs.org.uk and use the email subject "Curriculum Overview" so we can take into account more parental views on this topic and hopefully provide you with better information ready for next September. There is no point us working on improvements without knowing if they are helpful to you at home. Thank you for your input.

The recent donations for Ukraine have all been sent off-see page two for more information. Thank you in particular to Phoebe E in Year 13 who has organised this collection and also to Moorfield Primary School parents for their generous contributions.

Today almost all students have received a letter about Parent Governor elections (if you have 2+ children at NGHS, the eldest has the letter!) Votes need to be cast by this time next week - voting is not mandatory, but there is an opportunity to decide who will represent the views of parents on our Governing board. Later next week we are welcoming the West Midlands Regional Schools Commissioner to NGHS for a meeting with myself and our Chair of Governors about how well the school is performing and some ambitious projects they would like us to engage with.

Lastly, we have an Exam Performers Concert on Monday at 7pm. It is a relaxed, low-key event lasting about an hour. If you can, do come along and enjoy a mixture of musical genre from our talented musicians.

Head Girl Team Highlights...





Celebrating Neurodiversity

Neurodiversity is a term used to describe a variation in normal human evolution which means some people think differently to others. Neurodiversity conditions include autism, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), dyslexia, dyspraxia, Tourette syndrome and complex tic disorders.

Neurodiversity rejects the idea that autism and other neurological differences should be cured. Instead it advocates celebrating the strengths that come with neurological differences, such as:

- \Rightarrow Honesty
- ⇒ Attention to detail
- ⇒ Unique ability to focus on special interests
- ⇒ Problem solving
- ⇒ Seeing things from a different perspective
- ⇒ Logical thinking

It suggests that people with neurological differences do not need to change, they just need help and acceptance from those around them. The concept of neurodiversity can be very supportive for young people, as it provides a way of thinking about challenges as differences, rather than as deficits. Celebrating differences is important:

'It seems that for success in science a dash of autism is essential' (Hans Asperger)

A comic book has been created called,' The Umbrella Gang' and it tells the adventures about a gang of friends who are 'neurodivergent'. Take a look!

The auditions are open to everyone but this is a selection process and not everyone will be chosen to represent the school in this performance. There is a




limit on the number of dancers that we can take and the decision will be made based on performance in the audition next week.
