

I understand parents' recent frustrations with our catering App. Catering is contracted to a private company at NGHS and other surrounding secondary and primary schools. When the catering app system / biometric was put in place last academic year, we asked to use the industry-leader system. This was not possible, but, after some very difficult months, the caterers, Academy, have parted company with the current provider and are moving us over to the industry-leader, with which I have positive dealings in previous schools. This cannot happen until after exams to avoid mass disruption, but please be assured that students will continue to receive a lunch if their balance is low and this will need to be be repaid once the new system is up and running.

#### **Catering Cashless system update**

Many of you may have experienced failed transactions when using the Atalian Servest App or QR ordering platform in recent weeks. This is due to a now 'unsupported payment service platform' provided by our current payment service provider, highlighting transactions as fraudulent when they are not for your records.

As a result and because of the inconvenience caused, we have taken the decision to move away from our current cashless supplier over to new cashless provider which will support the 3DS secure payments functions accordingly.

In the meantime for any student that has insufficient funds on their account, as of the current procedure, we will provide the menu offerings and beverages of their choice and record a manual transaction for the relevant purchases made. Once the new account provider is live (date TBC with updates to follow) we will then ask you to top up your child's account to offset against these purchases if you are unable to continue to upload relevant funds to the current provider.

### RAMADAN AND EID

Muslims all around the world have recently been celebrating Eid as the holy month of Ramadan has come to an end. Ramadan is the 9<sup>th</sup> month of the Islamic calendar and the date at which Ramadan begins will change every year due to the Islamic calendar following the moon. Just as the Gregorian calendar is a solar calendar, the Islamic calendar is a lunar calendar. This year Ramadan began on 1st April.

You may already have a perception of Ramadan to be a time of fasting, while this is correct there is a lot more to this month than just abstaining from eating and drinking. It is also about staying away from bad habits and immoral behaviour such as arguing and lying so that you can improve your character and create new habits which can be practised throughout the rest of the year. Muslims also aim to improve their relationship with God by practising gratitude, giving to charity, attending the Mosque and reading more of the Quran (holy book).





Muslims begin fasting very early in the morning, just at the start of sunrise. Before this we have a morning meal called Suhoor. At Suhoor there is nothing in particular you need to consume but drinking lots of water and fruit is beneficial as it will give you enough energy to tackle the rest of the day. Then once the sun starts to set it is time to break the fast, this is traditionally done with dates and water as this is what the Prophet Muhammed used to do. After that, families and friends gather together to pray and then enjoy a meal, this is called Iftar.

What Muslims eat at Iftar is different for everybody and is completely your choice but most families will cook traditional food based upon their ethnic background. The duration of time in which Muslims are obliged to fast is different for Muslims in different countries as the sun sets earlier in some parts of the world than others. For example Muslims in New Zealand were able to break their fast at 5pm compared to Muslims in the UK breaking theirs at 8pm.

The exact ending time of Ramadan depends on the sighting of the moon but once the moon has been sighted the celebration of Eid begins. Eid is a time all Muslims look forward to, the community attends the mosque in the morning for the Eid prayer and then gets together with family and friends to spend time together and eat lots of great food.



Typically, Muslims on Eid wear clothes which embrace their culture and heritage and it is also very common for women to get henna done. For me, this year I enjoyed a barbeque with my family and exchanged lots of gifts!
