On behalf of the governors and staff at NGHS, may I welcome you all to the academic year 2022-2023. A special welcome also to all of our new readers. It has been a pleasure and delight to welcome everyone back to school this week. Almost everyone has taken on board Mrs Birch's reminders about uniform and our students appear ready to learn and succeed. Timetables are being learnt, rooms are being located and new friendships formed. It is an exciting time in the year.

We have also begun our new coach services from Wolverhampton, Shrewsbury and Telford this week. Thank you to over 120 families who have invested in this service. The coach company have, in return, invested in a brand-new 72-plate coach for the Wolverhampton route and a new app to track each coach's location. They have also been very responsive to niggles we have mentioned and we thank Lakeside Coaches and parents for their cooperation.

This summer's examination results were in another league! Our A-level students secured 83% A*-B (the highest in our region) and our GCSE students secured a jaw-dropping 90.2% Grade 9-7 (A*/A in old money!). Not only was NGHS miles ahead of other local schools, we are now ranked **EIGHTEENTH** in the country by The Times! These results are testament to not only the hard work of students, but the support of parents and outstanding teaching and pastoral guidance from my colleagues. Working in partnership and getting on with learning through the pandemic has paid off in spades and we congratulate all students on their impressive achievements.

As is often the case in September, I must ask everyone for support with the arrival/departure at school. It is busy outside the school gates. Students must always use the crossing point on Wellington Road and the front car park can be used for morning drop off but only **until 8.30am** when the barrier will come down and the car park should not be used by parents. Please make arrangements to drop off your child in Newport Town Centre for ease.

We have eight new colleagues who have joined NGHS this year. Some of them are introduced in this week's newsletter and the rest next week. We have a vibrant mix of highly experienced staff and those newer in their careers. This mix is what makes NGHS an exciting place to work and they have all taken the first week in post in their stride.

This week's newsletter also includes information about our vision for this academic year. As Headteacher, I prepare a development plan, which is approved by our Trustees (governors). As ever, we plan to achieve a lot in ten months

and we retain a steady focus on further enhancing the educational experience for all students, whether in the classroom or outside it. Clearly there is much in the news currently about the cost of living. The School must fund public-sector pay increases and rises in energy bills. We are acutely aware of parental income and have, for example, worked with the PTA to set up a second-hand uniform 'shop'. I must also raise awareness of Free School Meals. The days of a stigma around FSM are long gone. Since moving to cashless catering, there is no way of students knowing who is/isn't on FSM. A daily allowance is uploaded each morning for FSM students to spend in the same way as their peers. The school benefits from additional funding to support pupils with FSM (and Sixth Form Bursary) so please do look at our website (For Parents section) before making an application if you feel you are eligible.

By Monday the school website (www.nghs.org.uk) will display term dates for the 2023-24 year (For Parents). The Department for Education are clamping down on schools who authorise holidays in term time and my default answer must be **not** to authorise leave, unless the circumstances are exceptional. Prior to the summer holiday about 20 students left school early for cheaper flight prices/to visit relatives in the middle/far East. The financial implications are, I suppose, understandable, but, with a six week holiday, there is still a choice of dates to travel, so please kindly support us in ensuring any holidays are not taken in term time as we have to report absences of this type to the local authority and this can lead to fines being issued.

You may already have heard that Mrs Birch and Mr Pointon have put together a new rewards scheme at NGHS which is more immediate and encourages students to gather House points in four key areas (e.g. not *just* for doing good school work or not *just* for participating in a club/activity). More information can be found in the newsletter this week.

We have a number of parent events coming up, most of which are on Teams to avoid lots of parents travelling 45 minutes here for a 45 minute meeting. Heads of Year will be inviting you, so please look out for a letter. Year 12 is on Monday and Year 9 on Tuesday next week.

Lastly, but by no means least: As the first page shows we are in mourning the loss of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. I delivered an assembly to all staff and students this morning to commemorate her service and dedication to the United Kingdom and beyond. There may be further announcements concerning her funeral which may affect schools, and the DFE will update us in the coming days.

Financial Support for Year 12 and 13

Depending on circumstances, some NGHS students may be eligible for a bursary to support them with education-related costs. There are two types of bursary:

1. Vulnerable student bursary (students that are: in care, care leavers, in receipt of income support/universal credit/disability living allowance)
2. Discretionary bursary (students who need financial help but don't qualify for the vulnerable student bursary)

Bursary funds are paid directly to the student and are awarded to help students with the cost of travel, buying essential books or equipment, or partaking in curriculum-related trips.

Full details are available on the website along with the application form. Students are encouraged to speak to Mrs Davenport to discuss the support they may need and the evidence we would require before completing an application form.

We ask that applications are completed by the 30 September so we can award funds on a fair basis.

Applications can still be submitted after this date particularly if a student's circumstances change, however, the funds available Year 13 students that received a bursary in Year 12 must reapply this year.
