Year 11s need to focus on their own next steps after their mocks before Christmas and our Year 8 and Year 9 students will state their option preferences for GCSE this term. We will follow our attendance protocols and policy and thank you for your support with reducing any instances and co-operating with any sanctions necessary to get back on track.

Clearly our reputation and the recent Ofsted outcome are having a welcome, positive effect on our recruitment. If you know any Year I Is in other schools who wish to apply, please remind them of the deadline of 14th February.
