#### UCAS changes for 2025+ applications

#### \*\*This information is particularly important for Year 11 students\*\*

Each year we pride ourselves on providing bespoke support to our sixth form students with their applications to university through UCAS. Next year we will continue to help our students plan and write their personal statements, providing support through enrichment lessons, CEW and guest speakers.

However we would like to make you aware that for students who are planning on starting university in 2025 the national process will be changing. Students will no longer be required to write a personal statement but will instead be answering 6 questions. There will also be significant changes made to the references that schools are asked to provide.

Please be assured that we are already planning for these changes and will be working closely with UCAS in order to ensure that the level of guidance and support our students receive remains as extensive as it is today. We will be in touch with current Year II parents to provide further information.


#### Here you can see the number of N, G, H, S stickers awarded during December by form.

#### Attendance Heroes - December






