WEEK IS COMING!

From 13-16 February, Newport Girls' High School will celebrate its annual Charities Week. This is an invaluable opportunity for all of our students to work extremely hard to raise funds for the charities that have been selected by each house. This year Austen will be raising funds and awareness for **The Kinamba Community Project**, Roddam for **Papyrus Prevention of Young Suicide**, and Seacole for **Cancer Research UK**. Each of these charities has significance to our school community and local area, and it is therefore central that all students have the opportunity to contribute in as many ways as they are comfortably able to.

The week will be comprised of three main components:

Each day there will be a different whole-school theme for students and staff to partake in.

- Monday Students and staff will be coming dressed as their favourite subject. This could see you come dressed as a famous historian, an element from the periodic table, or a piece of famous art. The options are endless!
- Tuesday Students can accessorise in their house colours (including painting their nails which they can keep for the week)
- Wednesday Students and staff are encouraged to wear alternative footwear of their choice (the funnier the better and there will be various prizes for most alternative). Do be aware of Health & Safety with your choice!
- **Thursday** Finally, Thursday is Crazy Hair Day (the bigger the better, and again there will be prizes for the most weird and wonderful).

Students who wish to take part in this will be asked to pay a <u>minimum of £3 upfront</u> to their form tutor on the **Monday** and then can partake in all or any aspects of this that they choose.
