fter the hubbub of the first week of term, it is great to see the school settling down with the business of the autumn term. Our Year 7s have been handing in some impressive summer work

(see pages 5/6) and also now seem to know where they are going around the site(!) and our new Year 12s have made a fantastic first impression on our staff. It's great to see the new classrooms filling up and lessons being enjoyed. Some Year 8s were talking animatedly about their Physics lesson at the bus stop on Wednesday, I've been greeted in French and German around the school, my own Year 13 classes seem enthused about their work and gleeful shouts from the netball courts outside my window during PE have provided a welcome distraction from my work!

This week has also seen the launch of our Clubs and Co-Curricular programme. There is no stigma around FSM here and with our cashless catering system, students on FSM can purchase lunch in the same way regardless of whether parents have uploaded money or this has been automatically loaded from our FSM account each day. Do look here to see if you are eligible.

This week's NN includes an introduction to our remaining new staff. Also, I am honoured to include a lovely poem and piece of artwork from one of our Year 9s about Her late Majesty the Queen. See page 2 for an outstanding piece of work. 


