Today is the last day at NGHS for Mrs B Dugdale and Mrs A Seys. Mrs Dugdale has only worked at NGHS for a short time but has made a significant contribution to the development of our SEND team and is moving on to a position in the local authority. We wish her every success in her new post. After Easter we welcome Mrs H Arsalan who joins us as our new SEND Assistant.

Mrs Seys started at NGHS almost ten years ago as a teacher of History and English. Over the years she has turned her hand effectively to also teaching Geography and PSHE as well as holding the post of Head of Year 7 & 8 before taking a break and then returning a few years ago as Head of Year in our new rotational system. As well as being a very experienced teacher, I will remember Mrs Seys most for her dynamic and committed approach to the wider life of the school particularly in the arena of Holocaust Education (spearheading our UCL accreditation) and supporting the Bosnian community in Birmingham including taking a small group of students to Bosnia in 2017 to see for herself some of the challenges the country faces. She has also been the Lead Teacher for our Iris (LGBTQ+) Club and is responsible for our Kindness Ambassador status where she worked with colleagues and students from across the school to seek this accreditation. Personally, I

also very much enjoyed our time together (along with Mrs Griffin, Mrs Birch and 45 students) on the trip to Moscow and St Petersburg in 2019 which, as a Russian History expert, was a trip I know she will remember for a long time to come. Mrs Seys also served as Staff Governor during her time at NGHS and has helped with various fundraising appeals including for resources for our new buildings. We thank her for her massive contribution to the life of NGHS and wish her well in her new post in the higher education sector. After Easter we welcome Mrs R Webb to NGHS as a part time History & English teacher and Ms J Clarke who currently teaches History & Politics four days a week will be teaching here every day for the summer term to ensure our exam classes are taught by staff they know. As already announced, Miss J Walker has been appointed as Mrs Seys's replacement as Head of Year 8 and I am pleased to say that she is off her crutches and well enough to return after Easter. I would also like to thank Mr A Mason who returned from retirement to cover Miss Walker's classes in the last few weeks. Students will have been told if they have timetable changes / changes of teacher for the summer term.




PTA Hampers raise almost £1500!
