Dear Parent/Carer/Staff/Student/Community

At last Monday's Board of Trustees meeting, we discussed, in detail, the bee-keeping at NGHS proposal as well as the consultation feedback.

Over 200 people responded to our consultation including current and former students, staff, parents, Moorfield parents and the local community. Whilst there was a majority of positive responses, the commentary from those who were against, for a variety of important reasons, was felt to outweigh the benefits outlined in the proposal to house bees on the school site and therefore a motion was carried to **not proceed** with beekeeping on the school site.

However, a counterproposal was suggested to explore another location in the vicinity of the school, perhaps on farmland where a small group of girls and staff could keep bees and benefit from the education that this provides. Should you own any land locally or be aware of a location where this could be possible, with minimal intrusion, we would be delighted to hear from you.
