On Wednesday 23 November Year 7, 8 and 9 will have a live performance and Q & A

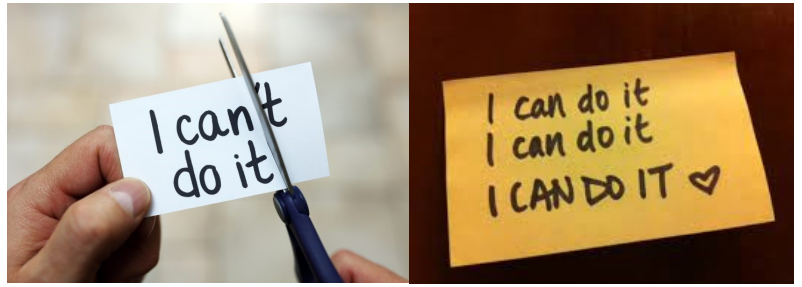
session from Prime Agency during one of their lessons. Belle is a 16-year-old singer/songwriter from the Midlands, busily marking out her own very individual creative vision. Having grown up in a family with

many years of music experience and success, Belle is already a confident performer, writer and singer. Belle will discuss mental health, the causes of mental health problems (stress at school, relationships etc), a time she had her own mental health issues, who to turn to for help and the importance of speaking up. She will also speak about the stresses of the pandemic, the loss we might all have felt and how we can all better handle the unpredictability and hardship of it all. She will give advice on how to stay safe online (Never giving out personal information, never meeting strangers online, safety on social network sites, following rules of your parents on the internet etc) as well as discussing cyber bullying and where to go for help. She will also discuss personal stories i.e. a time she was affected by cyber bullying, how she felt at the time, how she reacted, and the outcome of the situation. This will be a real opportunity for all our students taking part in the session and we look forward to informing you of how the event went in our next newsletter.

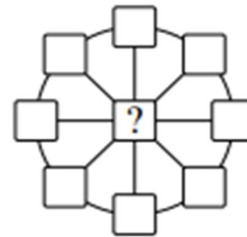

The sum of the three numbers on each diameter is 13 and the sum of the eight numbers on the circumference is 40. What number must be written in the central cell?



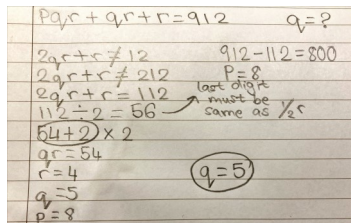

A disability is defined as a physical or mental impairment that has a 'substantial' and 'long-term' negative effect on your ability to complete normal daily activities under the Equality Act 2010. This means that not all disabilities can be seen and can affect people's day-to-day lives in a multitude of ways. At NGHS, we try hard to be as inclusive as possible, and students can approach members of the SEND team to better access the curriculum and school life overall. The SEND team offer a Friday AM registration drop in session in the Art Studio to provide additional support for SEND students/non-SEND student initial queries. There are also several clubs and activities which you can get involved with which cater to all needs and interests, the aim is that SEND students are able to fully participate in school life and have opportunities available to them the same as every other student.

Effects of Dementia Survey

Almost all of our Year 13 students complete an Extended Project Qualification, which is a dissertation-style essay of up to 5000 words or an artefact of their own creation. They supplement this with a diary-style production log and a presentation. Primary research is often required and one of our students is asking for help with this:

As part of my Extended Project Qualification on the effect of dementia on family and carers, I have to do my own research. For that reason, I have created a survey and I would really appreciate it if as many NGHS parents/carers could complete it to boost my research.

The survey is very simple and will take less than 5 minutes to complete. It is aimed at people who are either carers or are family members to a person who has suffered with dementia. The survey will remain anonymous, and all responses are forwarded directly to me, but some of the final data might be used by the health watch at the end of my project.
