






purchase copious amounts of chocolate! - Toblerone and Lindt were particularly popular!



3's RETAIN COUNTY INDOOR CRICKET TITLE!



On Friday 14th March the Under 13 Cricket Team travelled to Wrekin College to compete in the Shropshire County Cricket Finals for the second year running.

Playing against 5 other teams from around the county, they knew the standard was going to be a step up from the previous tournament and that is exactly what they found!

Match I v Ellesmere College WIN 56 - 55 (3 balls left!)

In their first group game, the team came up against the formidable shape of Ellesmere College! Boasting 3 outdoor cricket squares, 4 indoor batting lanes and numerous sports halls the Newport players knew we couldn't compete facilities

In their second match the team came up against another independent school knowing that a victory would see them into It's now to the West Midlands Regional Finals in Birmingham on the semi finals. Bowling first, Newport were starting to fire on 2nd May to see how much further the team can go! all cylinders and their famed tight bowling and constricting fielding helped keep the Ludlow Score down to 39 runs.

Knowing they couldn't be complacent, the batters came out and started hitting some impressive 4's and 6's and easily achieved the total of 40 runs needed to win with a 12 balls remaining!

Match 3 Semi Final v Shrewsbury High WIN 23 - 25 (3.5 overs remaining)

In the semi final, NGHS played against Shrewsbury High and it is no understatement to say they were absolutely dominant! In a devastating display of bowling, fielding and catching the opposition were held to a mere 23 runs before they were all out!

Knowing they just had to bat their 8 overs sensibly, their were no drama's as they comfortably reached the total required with nearly half of the balls still to be bowled - on to the final for the second year in a row!

Match 4 - Final v Packwood WIN 58 - 59 (with I wicket remaining!)

Having thoroughly dominated their semi final the Newport team had to wait for a tense semi-final between Packwood and Ellesmere College to finish to find out their opponent in the final. Packwood were victors by the slimmest of margins and so the girls knew the final would be a very tough match against another very strong independent school!

In the first over, NGHS managed to take 4 wickets for just 6 runs and it looked like they were going to cruise to a comfortable victory. However, Packwood dug in superbly and their middle order played magnificently before a final strong finish from the Newport bowlers restricted them to 58 for 6

Needing 59 to win the county title for the second consecutive year, the batters knew they were in for a titanic struggle. After losing a coupe of early wickets, it looked as if Packwood had the measure of the team.

However, some loose deliveries and intelligent shot making inched Newport closer to the total they needed. Needing 13 from the final 3 overs it seemed as if Newport were in the driving seat. However, wickets started to tumble and by the penultimate over they were down to just I wicket remaining and 3 runs needed! Lose one more wicket and the title would slip from their grasp!


NGHS STUDENTS WINS NATIONAL edreaker[,] cycling series!

who could see up close the fantastic artwork she created.




STUDENT SHOWCASE - TRULY OUTSTANDING ARTWORK FROM YEAR 9

CIENCE WRITERS COMPETITION 2025

A great opportunity to tests these skills is the Science writing competition, with this year's theme being chaos. The journalist category allows you to write a factual article with no more than 1500 words. It requires citations for all sources and all entries must be emailed to Mr Wade before 4pm on the 7th of April. Good luck!

A quick guide to writing scientifically for noobs!

Scientific articles are the best way for new and upcoming scientific information to penetrate the public sphere. Its point is to make complex scientific theories and research more widely accessible and understandable to the general public through concise, accurate information whilst still engaging the reader. However, this can be daunting so here are some tips to get you started:

Research - Before you even start writing do all your research from credible sources. It is vital to have the full picture on your subject before putting pen to paper. You cannot accurately write about a subject to a high standard if you have not gotten all the facts and giving readers only half of the truth can often be misleading and is a form of misinformation.

Clarity - Scientific writing is about being concise; overly descriptive sentences and general waffle will only serve to confuse and distract the readers from the points you are trying to make. Clarity helps make complex scientific concepts more understandable and accessible to a broader audience, thus improving readability.

Ensure accuracy and build empirical credibility -It is vital to base your writing off sound scientific evidence to ensure the credibility of your piece. Credibility is about building the trust of your readers to be truthful and fair. This means ensuring transparency by sourcing all papers and websites

used (Harvard method of citation https://youtu.be/ vcx4rfCHqSY?si=ff6LxfhfOHJGYcpQ) and only using credible sources of information. Maintaining a sense of scepticism is also key in science, after all the core of science is critical thinking and a discerning eye. Ask questions like what's the sample size? Do they have good methodology? Is there potential bias? Encourage the same approach in your readers and promote a questioning mind.

Know your audience and readers - Science is such an incredible and varied topic, offering an immense wealth of knowledge. The best way for information to penetrate to the public is through science articles. That's why it is so important to consider your audience and their expertise level relative to your chosen topic. If they are not knowledgeable in that area refrain from using lots of technical language and jargon as it can make your writing unreadable and inaccessible. Still use precise and correct language but where possible use simpler words.

Visuals and illustrations - Some topics in science can be very complicated and are hard to imagine or describe so some visual aid can go a long way in science articles, however, make sure every image incorporated is relevant and useful otherwise, they can work against you and distract or confuse the reader!




